What is Title 1?

Girls Global Academy is identified as a Title 1 school as a part of Every Student Succeeds Act. Title 1 is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title 1 programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement and done in collaboration.

What is it?

The plan describes how Girls Global Academy will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. The GGA community values collaboration with families and families are our partners. This plan describes the strategies that GGA will employ to support family engagement and how families can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it developed?
